### THE STORY

Written in 1945 by E.B. White, *Stuart Little* is about a boy named Stuart Little who is born into an ordinary New York family. What makes him different is that he is only 2 inches tall and looks exactly like a mouse. He has many adventures in the home with the Little family, the family cat, Snowball, and a songbird named Margalo. He has city adventures too, including getting caught in a window shade, sailing a boat, and learning about friendship and relationships.

The book was illustrated by Garth Williams. He illustrated many famous children's books including *Charlotte's Web* and the *Little House on the Prairie* series.

The story has been retold in numerous adaptations. There was an unabridged audio edition narrate by actress Julie Harris. There was a 1999 film version made of the story. In 1966 there was an episode of NBC's Children's Theater called *The World of Stuart Little*. There was even a series of video games created by Microsoft in 1999.

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# ABOUT THE AUTHORS



### WHO IS E.B. WHITE?



E. B. White was born in 1899 in New York as one of six children. He began his career as a reporter and worked in advertising as an essayist. As an author his most famous works are his children's books. He earned both the Pulitzer Prize and the Presidential Medal of Freedom. His book *Charlotte's Web* was a Newbery Honor winner. Later in life he suffered from Alzheimer's disease and passed away in 1985.

### WHO IS JOSEPH ROBINETTE?



Joseph Robinette, author and co-author of over 50 plays and musicals. Some of his most famous works are *Charlotte's Web*, *Stuart Little*, *Annie* and *Bye, Bye Birdie*. He is both a Tony Award Nominee and a Drama Desk Nominee. His work has been performed in 21 different countries and at least twelve of his plays have been translated into different languages.

#### **GRAMERCY PARK** is

an area of NYC that is very expensive to live in. It has a private park that only people who live in the 39 buildings around it can use. **BROADWAY** is a street in NYC that is also the most famous theater district in the world. It is known for huge bright signs and for being a hub of restaurants, stores, etc.

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### DID YOU KNOW?

New York City is made up of five sections known as boroughs. They are the Bronx, BrookyIn, Manhattan, Queens and Staten Island. Most people think of Manhattan when they think of New York City.

#### SAW MILL RIVER PARKWAY

is an almost 30 mile roadway with a park around it. It is named for the Saw Mill River that runs along the side of it.



**CENTRAL PARK** the largest park in NYC right in the center of Manhattan. It has fountains, sculptures, restaurants, a carousel and miles of trails.

#### SUPPLIES

- Large Paper Plate
- Gray Tissue Paper
- Gray Cardstock Paper
- Black Cardstock Paper
- School Glue
- Craft Scissors
- Office Stapler
- Large Wiggle Eyes

#### DIRECTIONS

- 1. Cut your gray colored tissue paper into small squares
- 2. Cut the paper plate in half, straight down the center to make two equal pieces.
- 3. Put glue all over one paper plate half.
- 4. Place the gray tissue paper on top of the glue until it's completely covered.
- 5. Cut out your tail, nose, whiskers, ears etc. in cardstock.
- 6. Staple/glue the cardstock pieces to the paper plate, add the wiggle eyes.
