BARBARA PARK

Barbara Park is the creator of the Junie B. Jones series, one of the most popular children's book collections of all time. Her stories have made readers laugh for over 20 years and have been enjoyed by millions of kids around the world.

Before becoming a writer, Barbara planned to be a teacher, but she soon discovered that she loved writing stories even more. She went on to write dozens of books filled with humor, heart, and unforgettable characters like Junie B.

Barbara received more than forty awards for her work, including several Children's Choice Awards. She lived in Arizona with her family and loved sharing stories that made kids laugh and feel understood.

Barbara Park passed away in 2013, but her books continue to bring joy to readers everywhere, and Junie B.'s adventures are still making people laugh today.

A first grader with a BIG personality and even bigger opinions. Junie B. is funny, dramatic, and not always the best at following the rules. She tells things exactly how she sees them, even if it gets her into trouble.



MAY

Junie B.'s classmate and frequent tattleteller. May likes rules, order, and being right. She and Junie B. do not always get along, especially when feelings get hurt or tempers get big.



MR. SCARY

The patient and often overwhelmed teacher of Room One. He tries his best to keep the class focused, calm, and kind, even when things get chaotic.



HERB

Junie B.'s best friend. Herb is loyal, supportive, and usually ready to agree with Junie B., even when things are a little questionable.



LUCILLE

A confident and dramatic classmate who loves fancy things and being the center of attention. She believes she has excellent taste and is not afraid to say so.



SHELDON

A classmate who worries a lot, especially about germs. Sheldon sometimes gets nervous, but he always tries his best to keep up with the class.



JOSÉ

A thoughtful and observant student who often helps explain things to others. José brings a calm and steady presence to the classroom.



MR. TOOT

The enthusiastic music teacher who loves putting on a good performance. He helps the class prepare for the Holiday Sing Along.



ELF ELLEN

A cheerful parent volunteer who helps during the holiday activities. She adds to the festive spirit of the classroom.



GRANDPA

Junie B.'s grandfather. He is kind, caring, and always ready to give advice or tell a meaningful story.



PHILIP JOHNNY BOB

Junie B.'s stuffed elephant and trusted companion. He may not talk, but he is always there when Junie B. needs him.

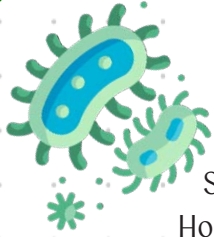

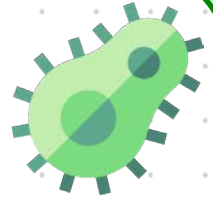

- ♦ Take a deep breath and say "Jingle Bells."
- ♦ Try saying it without taking a deep breath first.
- ♦ Notice the difference.

- ♦ Why do singers need to take deep breaths?

- ♦ What happens if you run out of breath while talking or singing?

- ♦ Why is breathing important for a performance?

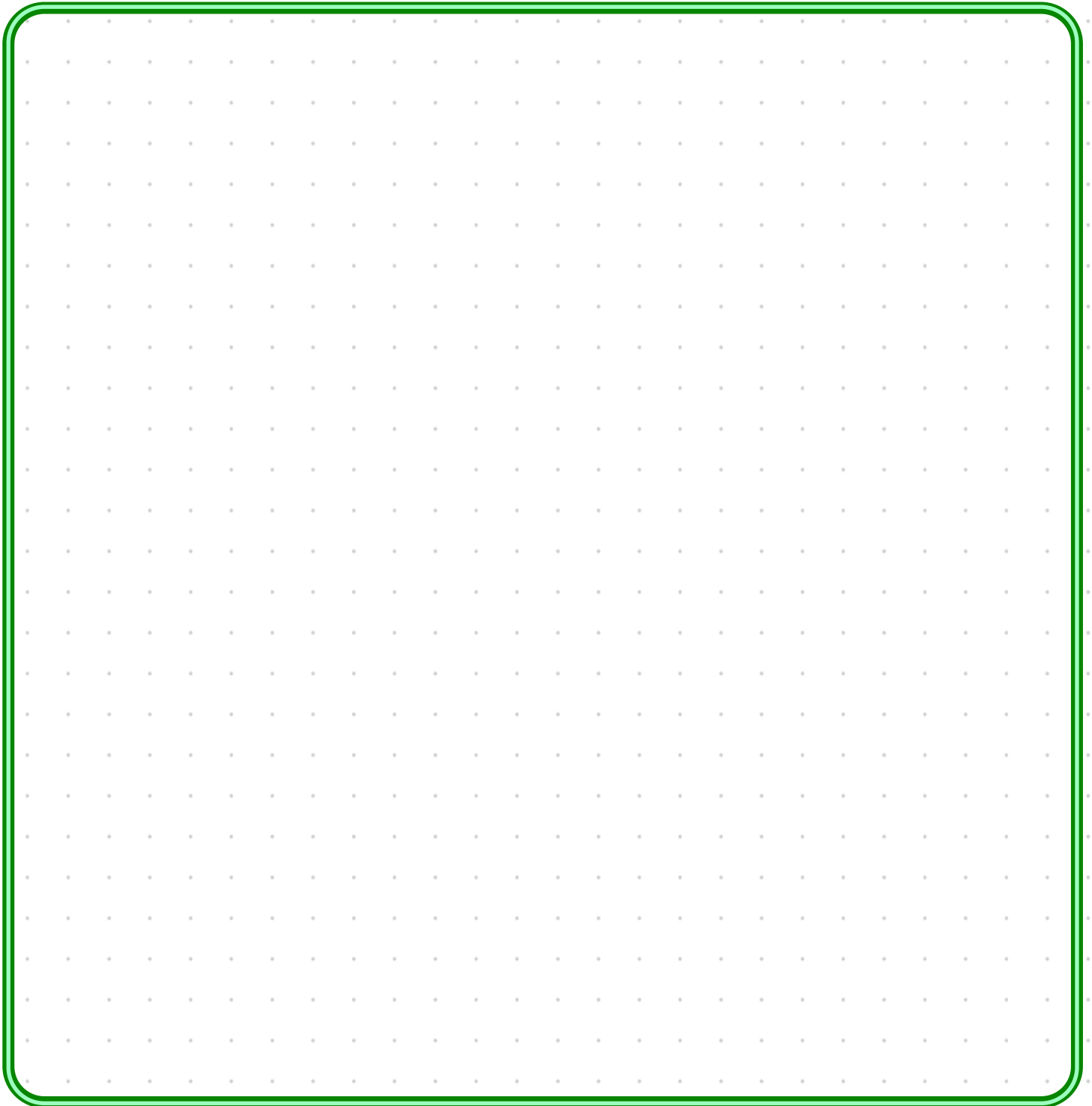

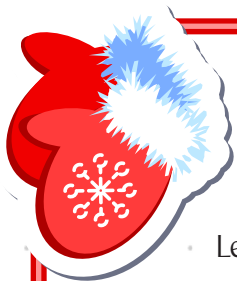


DESIGN YOUR OWN COVER!

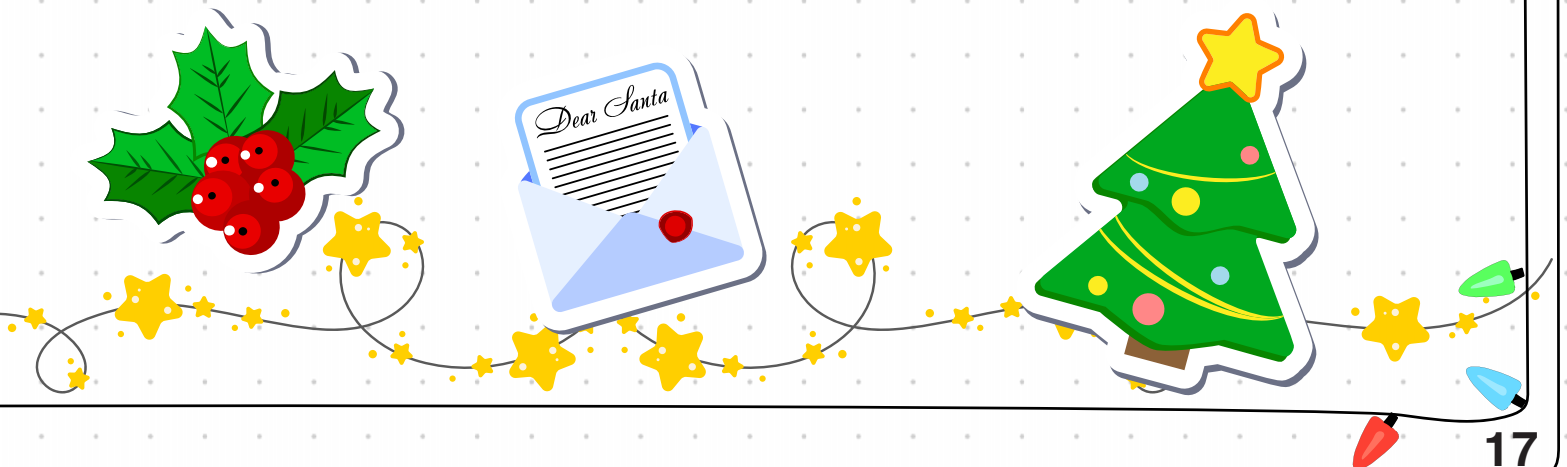

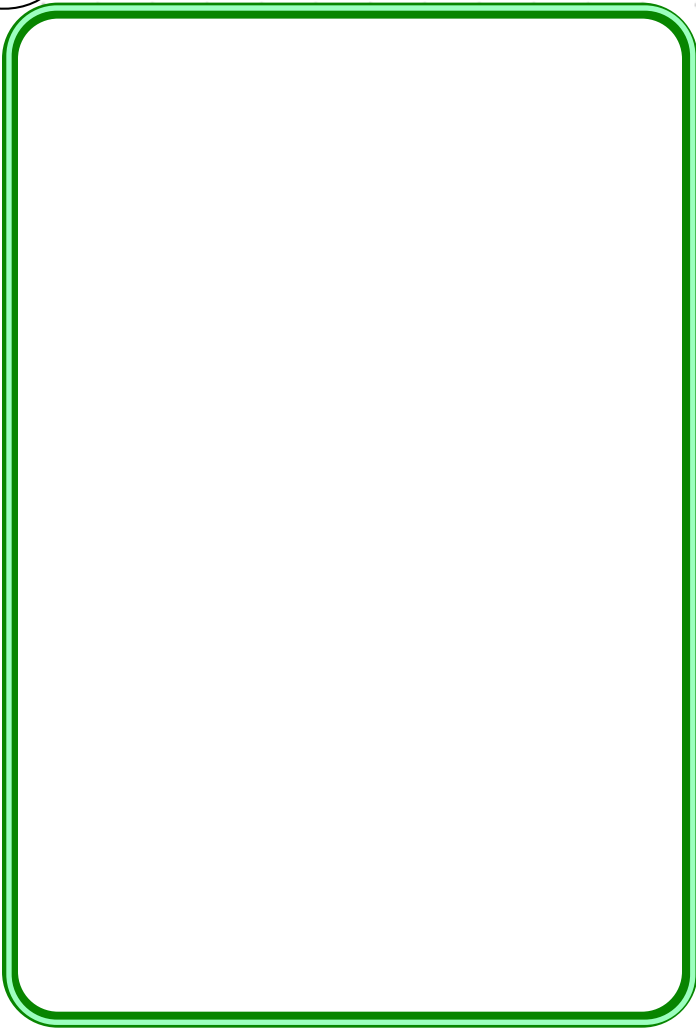

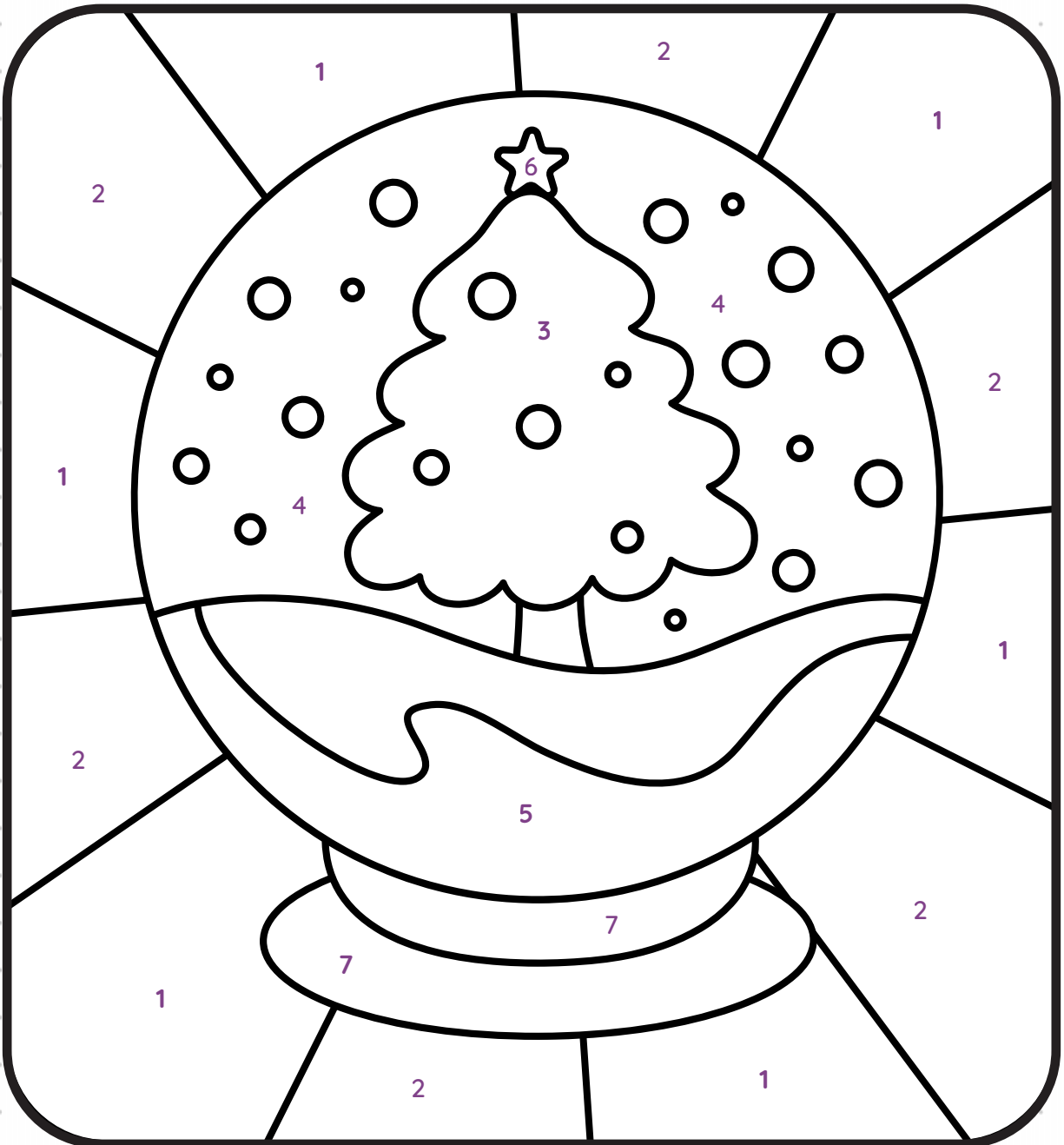

EGGNOG COOKIES



INGREDIENTS:

- ♦ 2 1/4 CUPS FLOUR
- ♦ 1 TSP BAKING SODA
- ♦ 1/2 TSP NUTMEG
- ♦ 1/4 TSP CINNAMON
- ♦ 1 CUP BUTTER
- ♦ 1 CUP SUGAR
- ♦ 1 EGG
- ♦ 1/2 CUP EGGNOG

PROCESS:

Mix dry ingredients. Cream butter and sugar.



Add egg and eggnog. Combine with dry ingredients.



Bake at 350°F (175°C) for 10–12 minutes.
