DIRECTOR'S NOTE LAURA MORENO

The theatre has the ability to transport its audience to anywhere in the world, at any time, with larger- than-life characters and elements that only exist in our dreams. But what if instead of escaping, the story being presented highlighted the beauty of our community, the diversity of its people and the very things that make it special? The Last Stop On Market Street does just that. Our version takes place in Houston, TX and shines light on just a few of the things that make our city great. As an audience, we'll witness the importance of cross-generational relationships watching Nana guide CJ through the story and city, and open his eyes to a life outside of the one he knows. It's a necessary journey that illustrates the importance of perspective - how things are not always what they seem, the understanding of cultures, differences and the inequities in the world, and ultimately the importance of empathy and kindness. Oh, and keep an eye out! Our production showcases CJ's point of view through the presentation of 3D props for all the items he values and holds dear, and 2D props to highlight the things that might have value to others but hold little importance to CJ. It is our hope that by presenting CJ's journey in such a way it will allow for a bit of magic when we experience CJ's perspective shift - maybe, if we're lucky, we will all feel the flutter of a changing heart collectively.

Main Street Theater's Fellowship Program is a paid artistic leadership development program for early-career BIPOC individuals. Applicants will submit a resume and portfolio and three candidates will be selected. The selected fellows will be assigned to a production either with the MainStage or Theater for Youth programs in their area of interest (Directing, Design, or Stage Management) while being given access to additional professional development opportunities within the Main Street Theater organization.

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
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
