

A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR REBECCA GREENE UDDEN

A number of years ago – shortly after Thomas Gibbons wrote this play — I joined a learning circle through the American Leadership Forum to study Racism. It was a year-long program, meeting once a month for reading and conversation with members from all racial groups. When the course was finished, a number of us wanted to continue examining this topic, meeting once a month to this day. Over the years our conversation has become more focused – although, to our regret, we have found no clear answers. The one constant has been the recognition that the other person has a point of view that is valid and meaningful to them. Acknowledging this is an act of grace. Ignoring it leads to the situation the characters in *Permanent Collection* face. As you watch this performance, if you are a person of empathy, you will find yourself in agreement with one character only to have that opinion reversed in the next beat. Twenty years has not changed the conversation except to make us more aware of how sensitive and how necessary it is. I hope you will find this play as provocative and as chastening as I do.

Thomas Gibbons is playwright-in-residence at InterAct Theatre in Philadelphia, which has produced eight of his plays: *Pretending to America, 6221, Axis Sally, Black Russian, Bee-luther-hatchee, Permanent Collection, A House With No Walls*, and *Silverhill*. His plays have been seen at the National Playwrights Conference at the Eugene O'Neill Theatre Center, off-off-Broadway at Blue Heron Theatre, Mixed Blood Theatre, Northlight Theatre, Actors Express, Florida Stage, Unicorn Theatre, Repertory Theatre of St. Louis, Arizona Theatre Company, Center Stage, New Repertory Theatre, Aurora Theatre, Roundhouse Theatre and many others. He is the recipient of seven playwriting fellowships from the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts, a Roger L. Stevens Award from the Fund for New American Plays, a Barrie and Bernice Stavis Playwriting Award, an NAACP Theatre Award, two Barrymore Awards for outstanding new play, and a Pew Fellowship in the Arts. *Permanent Collection* was the pilot selection of the National New Play Network's Continued Life of New Plays Fund, and *A House With No Walls* was a subsequent selection.

ABOUT THE PLAY PARALLELS TO THE BARNES FOUNDATION

Inspired by events at the Barnes Foundation, one of the world's greatest collections of impressionist, post-impressionist & modern art, Thomas Gibbons explored the impact of race and racial equity on society through his play, *Permanent Collection*.

Permanent Collection made its world premiere in Philadelphia at InterAct Theatre Company in the fall of 2003. Around this same time the Barnes Foundation was still mired in controversy: a prolonged, public and legal battle that started from a 1995 lawsuit. The Friends of the Barnes Foundation, a citizens' group dedicated to protecting the permanent collection, sued then-president Richard Glanton for slander after he accused them of racism when they opposed plans to build a parking lot at the Foundation's suburban location in Merion. This is one of many real-world parallels Gibbons uses in this play.

The eccentric founding director of the Barnes, art collector Albert C. Barnes, is mirrored most closely in Gibbons' character Alfred Morris. Barnes was known for being paternalistic and hot-tempered, and he engaged in a number of public rows with employees, art critics, and museums.

Mr. Barnes had deep respect for African-Americans, and in his will left his foundation to be administered by Lincoln University, a traditionally black college. He was an advocate for public art but only allowed a select few to see his collection. As a selfmade man, Barnes despised phonies and snobs.

Barnes' collection included: 181 Renoirs, 69 Cezannes, 59 Matisses, 46 Picassos, 16 Modiglianis and 7 Van Goghs. Barnes' trust stipulated curious specifications for his displays that insisted "the paintings be hung densely amid medieval relics, African art and modernist furniture." Further, "nothing from the collection should be lent, sold or moved on the walls and remain exactly as it was" in the original Merion location. He also forbade "any society functions, tea parties, dinners, banquets, dances, musicales or similar affairs" where the art would be exhibited. The trust also stipulated that the Barnes Foundation would remain educational, with the collection to be open to the public only a few days a week.

Actors' Equity Association (AEA) was founded in 1913 as the first of the American actor unions. Equity's mission is to advance,
